

WINDSOR HOTEL CHANGES HANDS

**E. and L. A. Caughey, Oshawa,
Purchase Property From
T. J. Gillespie**

The Windsor Hotel, one of the finest hotel properties in Western Ontario, changed hands on Saturday, being sold by Thomas Gillespie, the proprietor for 23 years, to E. and L. A. Caughey of Oshawa. The deal includes the hotel property and contents only, and not the entire Windsor block. George Langan was the agent. Mr. Gillespie, the retiring owner, was one of the best known hotel men in the business. The new owners are experienced, having been in charge of the Commercial Hotel in Oshawa, which was disposed of four months ago. Since then they have lived in Toronto.

Immediate steps to make the hotel one of the most up-to-date are being taken. A staff of paper hangers, decorators and electricians are already at work transforming a large number of the rooms. Some will be refurnished. It is the aim of the new proprietors to make the service in the hotel outstanding, and fill a need in the city by supplying another first class hostelry.

There are 60 rooms in the building, which has a spacious rotunda and a beautifully decorated, large dining room.
